Seek Ye First the Kingdom of God

- I. Keep looking forward.
 - 1. This has been a sad ending for the Minneapolis Church.
 - 2. Though this is the end of the Minneapolis Church, it should not be the end of your Christian walk.
 - A. Individual churches don't last forever.
 - B. Some get sick and eventually die (Rev 2:5; Rev 3:1-3).
 - C. A local church is a body made up of members (1Co 12:12-14, 27).
 - D. When a body dies, the remaining members need to be grafted into another body.
 - E. The Minneapolis Church is a body on life support.
 - F. Like the organs of an organ donor, the members can be inserted into another body where they will be beneficial (this is only an analogy -- I am not advocating organ donation).
 - 3. We cannot turn back time, but we can keep marching ahead faithfully.
 - 4. Forget those things which are behind (but learn from them), and press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus (**Php 3:13-14**).
 - 5. A just man falls seven times and rises up again (Pro 24:16).
 - A. The Lord will not allow a good man to utterly fall (Psa 37:23-24).
 - B. God delivered you from a life of sin, false religion, ignorance, and deception when He brought you to faith in Christ and into His church.
 - C. If you remain steadfast and faithful, He will continue to deliver you from this wicked world for the rest of your lives (**Job 5:19-20; 2Co 1:10**).
 - D. This may seem like a dark time in your Christian life, but the Lord will be a light to you (**Mic 7:8**).
 - E. Get up, shake off the dust, and keep serving Jesus Christ in His church (Isa 52:2).
 - F. If you are upset with me for leaving to pastor another church, don't let that stop you from presenting your body as a living sacrifice to God in His house (**Rom 12:1**).
 - G. Your commitment to Jesus Christ must not be conditioned on the actions of others.
- II. The church of Jesus Christ is the most important place in the world.
 - 1. The church is the house of God, the pillar and ground of the truth (1Ti 3:15).
 - 2. We ought to have a *zeal* for it like Jesus did (Joh 2:13-17).
 - 3. There is nothing more important in a Christian's life than to be in God's church.
 - A. A Christian should seek *first* the kingdom of God (Mat 6:33).
 - B. We should desire to be in the church all the days of our lives (Psa 23:6).
 - C. It should be the one thing that is desired above all else (Psa 27:4).
 - D. They who dwell in God's house are blessed (Psa 84:4).
 - E. A day in God's house is better than a thousand days anywhere else (Psa 84:10).
 - F. God loves His house more than any of ours (Psa 87:2).
 - G. The church should be preferred above one's chief joy (Psa 137:5-6).
 - H. If you are going to flourish in your Christian life, you must be planted in the house of God (**Psa 92:13-14**).
 - 4. We must never forsake the assembling of ourselves together (Heb 10:22-25).
 - A. <u>Forsake v. 1. trans</u>. To deny (an accusation, an alleged fact, etc.). *Obs.* 3. To give up, renounce. a. To give up, part with, surrender (*esp.* something dear or valued).

Passing into sense 4. 4. To abandon, leave entirely, withdraw from; *esp.* to withdraw one's presence and help or companionship from; to desert.

- B. To abandon or withdraw from a local church and not join and assemble with another one is to forsake the assembling of the saints which is sin.
- 5. Sometimes being part of a church means being a nonresident member. Some examples are:
 - A. The Ethiopian eunuch (Act 2:41-42 c/w Act 8:38-39 c/w Isa 56:3-5)
 - B. Onesimus (Col 4:9)
 - C. Epaphras (Col 4:12)
 - D. The saints that were scattered from Jerusalem because of the persecution (Act 11:19).
 - E. The men of Israel were required to travel to Jerusalem three times each year to worship at the house of God (**Deu 16:16**).
 - F. They were in effect nonresident members of the church in Jerusalem.
- 6. My advice is that nonresident membership should only be a means to an end.
 - A. Your goal should be to assemble with the saints as much as possible (Heb 10:25).
 - B. Assembling with the church a few times or less per year as a nonresident member may meet the minimum requirement, but do you want your service to God to be only the minimum requirement?
 - C. Some people may not be able to move to be a resident member of a church, and if that's the case, then God accepts what you have (**2Co 8:12**).
 - D. But if you can move to be a resident member and you choose not to, then you are missing out on a blessed and rich Christian life that you could have.
 - E. You will get out of your religion what you put into it.
- III. If you fervently desire for there to be a church here in Minneapolis again, God might grant it.
 - 1. The Jews returned to the land after the Babylonian captivity (Ezr 1:1-6).
 - 2. They earnestly desired it (Psa 137:1-6; Neh 1:1-11).
 - 3. The temple (the house of God) was rebuilt after it had been destroyed, but not without much work (Ezr 2:68-69; Ezr 3:6-13; Ezr 4:4-5; Ezr 6:13-15).
 - 4. In our own generation churches have died and been rebuilt.
 - A. The church in Pennsylvania died in the 1990s, but many of those brethren came back and eventually were constituted into a new church there in 2017.
 - B. The church in Edmonton died in 2012, but the Lord raised up a new church of like-faith in Edmonton in the last couple of years.
 - 5. If you want it, ask, seek, and knock earnestly for it (Mat 7:7-8).
 - 6. In the mean time, join a true church and serve God to the best of your ability.
 - 7. If you are faithful with little, God may commit more to you (Luk 16:10-12).
