Swearing and Taking Oaths

- I. By looking at the following verses one could conclude that Christians are forbidden from taking an oath of any kind.
 - 1. **Mat 5:33** Again, ye have heard that it hath been said by them of old time, Thou shalt not forswear thyself, but shalt perform unto the Lord thine oaths:
 - 2. Mat 5:34 But I say unto you, <u>Swear not at all</u>; neither by heaven; for it is God's throne:
 - 3. Mat 5:35 Nor by the earth; for it is his footstool: neither by Jerusalem; for it is the city of the great King.
 - 4. **Mat 5:36** Neither shalt thou swear by thy head, because thou canst not make one hair white or black.
 - 5. **Mat 5:37** But let your communication be, Yea, yea; Nay, nay: for whatsoever is more than these cometh of evil.
 - 6. **Jas 5:12** But above all things, my brethren, <u>swear not</u>, neither by heaven, neither by the earth, <u>neither by any other oath</u>: but let your yea be yea; and your nay, nay; lest ye fall into condemnation.
- II. Defining the terms
 - 1. <u>Swear</u> v. I. 1. *intr*. To make a solemn declaration or statement with an appeal to God <u>or a</u> <u>superhuman being</u>, or to some sacred object, in confirmation of what is said; to take an oath.
 - 2. <u>Oath</u> *n*. 1. a. A solemn or formal appeal to God (or to a deity or something held in reverence or regard), in witness of the truth of a statement, or the binding character of a promise or undertaking; an act of swearing; a statement or promise corroborated by such an appeal, or the form of words in which such a statement or promise is made.
- III. God commanded in the O.T. that swearing was to only be done by His name.
 - 1. Deu 6:13 Thou shalt fear the LORD thy God, and serve him, and shalt swear by his name.
 - 2. **Deu 10:20** Thou shalt fear the LORD thy God; him shalt thou serve, and to him shalt thou cleave, and <u>swear by his name</u>.
 - 3. **Isa 65:16** That he who blesseth himself in the earth shall bless himself in the God of truth; and <u>he that sweareth in the earth shall swear by the God of truth</u>; because the former troubles are forgotten, and because they are hid from mine eyes.
- IV. The Pharisees had turned the law of God on its head and required people to swear by anything except God and His name.
 - A. **Mat 23:16** Woe unto you, ye blind guides, which say, Whosoever shall swear by the temple, it is nothing; but whosoever shall swear by the gold of the temple, he is a debtor!
 - B. Mat 23:17 Ye fools and blind: for whether is greater, the gold, or the temple that sanctifieth the gold?
 - C. Mat 23:18 And, Whosoever shall swear by the altar, it is nothing; but whosoever sweareth by the gift that is upon it, he is guilty.
 - D. Mat 23:19 Ye fools and blind: for whether is greater, the gift, or the altar that sanctifieth the gift?
 - E. **Mat 23:20** Whoso therefore shall swear by the altar, sweareth by it, and by all things thereon.
 - F. Mat 23:21 And whoso shall swear by the temple, sweareth by it, and by him that dwelleth therein.
 - G. **Mat 23:22** And he that shall swear by heaven, sweareth by the throne of God, and by him that sitteth thereon.

- V. Jesus Christ and James both commanded us to not swear by the following things:
 - 1. Heaven (God's throne)
 - 2. Earth (God's footstool)
 - 3. Jerusalem (God's city)
 - 4. Our own heads (of which we can't even change the hair color)
- VI. Notice that neither Jesus Christ, nor James said that we should not swear by God or His name, never stating something such as "neither swear by God nor His name".
 - 1. All the things they specified that were not to be sworn by were things that carry no real weight when it comes to binding us to our oaths.
 - 2. These types of things -- things other than God and His name -- are what are prohibited by the commandments to "swear not at all" (Mat 5:34), "swear not" (Jam 5:12), and "neither by any other oath" (Jam 5:12).
- VII. It can be concluded that swearing by God was not condemned by Jesus or James, in that the apostle Paul (our example 1Co 11:1) swore by God on a few occasions.
 - 1. **2Co 1:23** Moreover I call God for a record upon my soul, that to spare you I came not as yet unto Corinth.
 - 2. Gal 1:20 Now the things which I write unto you, behold, before God, I lie not.
 - 3. **Php 1:8** For God is my record, how greatly I long after you all in the bowels of Jesus Christ.
- VIII. Therefore, if you choose to swear or take an oath, do so only by God and not anything else.
- IX. If you are not comfortable doing so, as Paul was, then don't swear at all and simply let your yea be yea, and your nay, nay.
